*Principal

Randy Karon has been the director of bands at Barrington High School for the last 16 years, and is the director of the concert, marching, and jazz bands, as well as musical pit orchestra and pep band conductor. Previous teaching assignments included Williamsburg and Indianola high schools (Iowa). While at Barrington, concert bands, jazz bands, and jazz combos have consistently earned superior ratings and high placement at contests and festivals. Additionally, the Barrington bands and jazz bands regularly utilize guest clinicians and performers. The jazz bands have commissioned 12 works for premier performance.

Mr. Karon earned a Bachelor of Music Education and Master of Arts in Conducting from the The University of Iowa. While at The University of Iowa, he directed the University Band, was the assistant director of the Hawkeye Marching Band, directed Jazz band II and pep band. Currently, he is a member of the popular 6-piece Chicago jazz combo, "Bopology", and is a permanent or adjunct member of The Chicago Skyliners Big Band, the Bobby Sanders Big Band, the Dana Legg Stage Band, and the Vito Buffalo Orchestra. Performance credits include Steve Houghton, Terry Gibbs, Rob McConnell, Pete Christlieb, Bobby Shew, Phil Wilson, and Joanne Castle. Professional affiliations include MENC, IMEA, IEA, NEA, and IAJE.

Gary R. Shaw, Professor of Music and Director of Bands, has taught trombone, wind ensemble, and conducting at Millikin since 1982. He currently performs on trombone with the Millikin Faculty Brass Quintet, the Millikin-Decatur Symphony Orchestra, the Decatur Municipal Band, and the Sinfonia da Camera. Dr. Shaw's groups have toured and performed extensively in Germany, Austria and The Netherlands. In March 1998, the Wind Ensemble traveled to the Dominican Republic where they taught beginning band students at the Instituto Cultural Domenico Americano. Last spring, Dr. Shaw worked with adult municipal bands in the Dominican Republic through a program sponsored by the U.S. Embassy in Santo Domingo. Dr. Shaw is resident conductor of both the Decatur Youth Symphony Orchestra and the Greater Decatur Youth Band. He holds the DMA from the University of Wisconsin-Madison.

Neal Smith, conductor of the **University Concert Band**, has recently completed a PhD in Music Education at The Hartt School of the University of Hartford. Professor Smith has written articles for Music Educators National Conference publications and given a number of presentations for school districts and MENC conventions. In addition, he has guest conducted for numerous regional, county, and district festivals as well as the Hartford Chamber Players, Kenosha Symphony Orchestra and Manchester(CT) Symphony. As an administrator he has directed the Hartt Summer Young Music Festival, coordinated the Roberts Center for Young Leadership in the Arts, and was the Executive Director of the Paranov Arts Partnerships in Connecticut. He has taught music in the public schools from kindergarten through high school in Antioch, Illinois and Granby, Connecticut, and has worked with student groups including the Connecticut Youth Symphony and Young People's Orchestra. A strong believer in amateur music making, he founded two adult amateur concert bands, the Lakes Area Community Band in Illinois and the Capitol Symphonic Winds. At Millikin he teaches secondary methods, supervises student teachers, and conducts the Concert Band.

Joshua Thompson has been the band director at Lake Zurich High School for eleven years. He directs the school's top two concert bands, two jazz ensembles, pep band, pit orchestra and the 200 member marching band. He also manages the MIDI lab and teaches electronic music composition.

Mr. Thompson earned his Master's in Music Education from Vandercook College of Music and has his Bachelor's from Northwestern University. He was selected this year by the Lake Zurich Area Chamber of Commerce as this year's "Outstanding Educator." He studied clarinet with Russell Dagon and Clark Brody and played in bands with Don Owens, John Paynter, and Steve Peterson. He was a member of the 1994 Disneyland All-American College band. Before Lake Zurich, Mr. Thompson taught for two years in the Kankakee School District. He met his wife, Ruthie, at Harvest Bible Chapel in Rolling Meadows and they now reside in Lake Zurich with their four children, Jack (6), Kate (4), Dane (2.5) and Gracie (1) He is a member of Harvest Bible Chapel in Lake Zurich, Illinois where he plays clarinet and saxophone on the worship team.
