Books

1. A book with one author (with an anonymous author, just omit author item)

Author. Title. City of Publisher: Publisher, date.

Example:

Maxfield, Clark. Women in Film. New York: Oxford UP, 1982.

2. A volume within a multivolume set

Author. Title. Vol. of Volume Title. Editor. number of vols. City of Publisher: Publisher, date.

Example:

Rassele, Claus. The Eternal Fire. Vol. 3 of The Complete Prose of Claus Rassele.

Ed. Randal Wiles. 9 vols. Chicago: U of Chicago P, 1959.

3. A multivolume work or a specialized encyclopedia or dictionary.

"Title of Article". Title of Multivolume Work. Editor. Volume number. City of Publisher: Publisher, Date. Pages.

Example:

"Franklin, Benjamin." Dictionary of American Biography. Ed. Dumas Malone. Vol. III. New York: Scribners, 1959. 585-599.

Magazines

4. An article in a weekly or biweekly (An article without author, just omit that item)

Author. "Title of Article." Title of Magazine date (day month year): pages.

Example:

Banks, Sandra. "The Devil's on Our Radio." People 7 May 1986: 72-74.

5. An article in a magazine on CD-ROM

Author. "Title of Article in Magazine." Title of Magazine. date (day month year): pages. Distributor on CD-ROM. Publisher. Date of Publication.

Example:

Dunn, Mary. "Scotland." National Geographic. 10 July 1992: 16-28. Ebsco Middle Search on CD-ROM. Ebsco Publishing, May 1996.

Newspapers

6. An article in a daily with two authors and numbered sections

Authors. "Title of Article." Title of Newspaper date (day month year), section number: page.

Example:

Clark, Trisha, and James Kirsch. "Racism and Apathy Join Hands at NIU." Chicago Tribune 21 Sept. 1987, section 3.2.

Encyclopedias and other reference sources

7. A signed article in an encyclopedia (unsigned, just omit author item)

Author. "Title of Article." Title of Encyclopedia. date of ed.

Example:

Clausen, Mark. "Taiwan." Encyclopedia Britannica. 1985 ed.

8. A signed article in a reference book (unsigned, just omit author item)

Author. "Title of Article." Title of Reference Book. date of ed.

Example:

Whitney, Elderidge. "Calvin Coolidge." Dictionary of American Biography. 1975 ed.

9. Encyclopedia on CD-ROM

Author. "Title of Article." Title of Encyclopedia. Version. Format. Publisher, date.

Example:

Smith, Lee. "Norway." The 1995 Grolier Multimedia Encyclopedia. CD-ROM. Grolier
Electronic P, 1995.

10. On-line material and databases: commercial services, computer networks, Internet, E-mail, and other on-line postings.

Examples:

"Civil War." Academic American Encyclopedia. On-line. Prodigy. 30 Mar. 1993.

Sanders, Barbara. "Living a Life of Style." Current Culture (12 Nov. 1994): On-line.
Internet. 10 Dec. 1994.

Interview

11. Name of Interviewee. Interview with author. date (day month year).

Example:

Cook, Peter. Personal interview. 27 July 1990.

Radio or television programs

12. Title of program. Network. Local Station, City. date (day month year).

Example:

The First Americans. NBC. KNBC, Los Angeles. 21 Mar. 1988.
